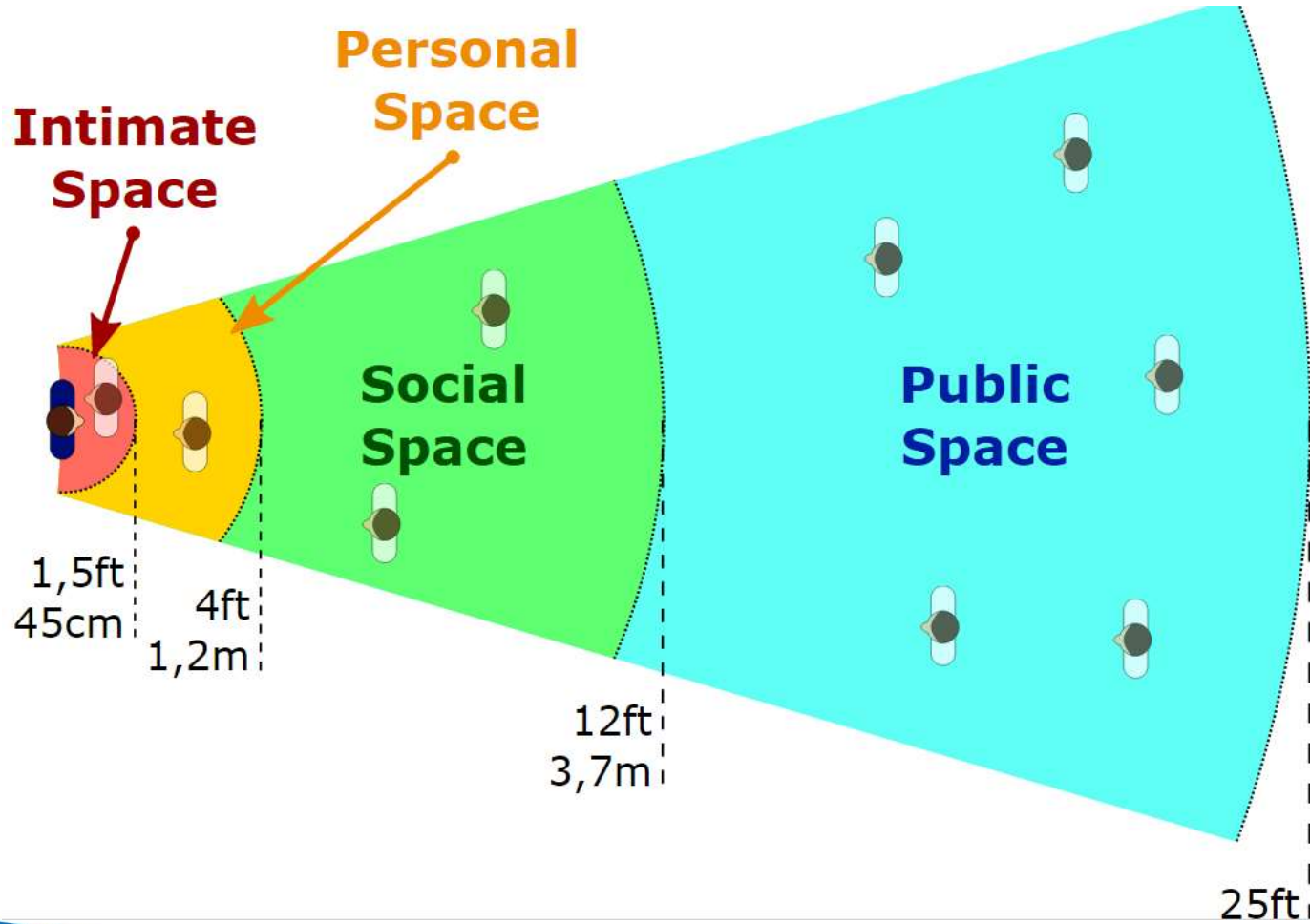

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# Personal Space



## Indirect holds


- Larger contact area
- Hold is from behind
- Less tension on staff member's forearms, shoulders, chest and back

General Principles need to be applied

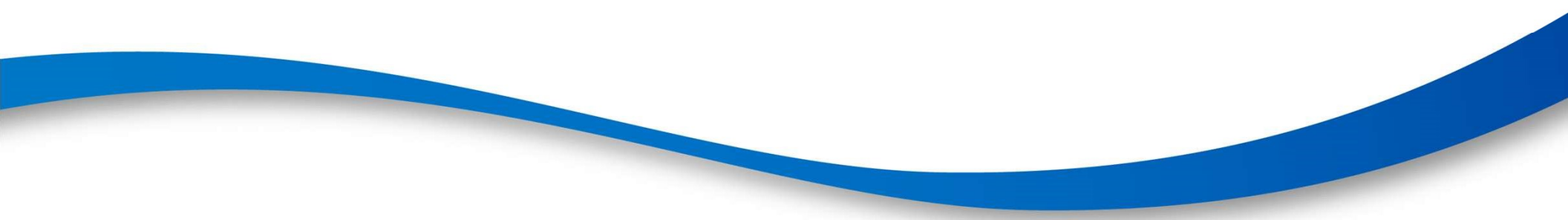
The NHSBT currently have 6 Safe Systems of Work

- DAT198 - Talking the Donor from Floor to Sitting to Standing
  - DAT169 - Assisting a recovered Donor to Walk
  - DAT197 - Donor Faints from Standing
  - DAT199 - Donor Faints at the Refreshment Table
  - DAT170 - Emergency Evacuation of a Fainted Donor
  - DAT2025 - Moving Donor from Donation Chair to Floor for CPR
